My first dog show was in 1989. I came home with a prize card, that was the start of my dog showing life. Nearly 30 years later I still get a buzz showing my dogs.

I was delighted to be invited to judge for The Merseyside Boxer Club - such a friendly lot. The last time I judged Dogs was in 2011 for London & Home Counties Boxer Club.

This will be my 7th time awarding Challenge Certificates and I'm looking forward to it immensely.

Bitches: Sue Garner (Aivlys)

I have had dogs from a very early age and in 1968 I had to have a very large cross breed male put to sleep (he had a large tumour), he was only 8 years old. It was not long before we had another dog, a female PMD. We were advised to take her to training classes, which we did. Well after a few weeks, when all was going well, the trainers' dog, a GSD, took a dislike to her and attacked her, well that was the end of doing any word off the lead. We were then advised to take her to Ring Craft Training, I did not have a clue what I was letting myself in for and this was the beginning of my showing dogs.

I must have chosen well when I purchased her, because she did a lot of winning, I made her up at LKA Nov 1971 and had BOB at Crufts 1972 - CH Godura de Fontenay.

I tried to breed from her but I should not have left it so late, I did eventually get one bitch pup, Awton Premier Edition, which I had to hand rear, it was like having a baby, she went everywhere I went, even to shows that I was on the committee of, I could leave Mum at home but the puppy had to be fed so many times a day, all the hard work we put in paid off. She was top winning bitch in breed and won 25 CCs, 12 were won in 1975 and she was Reserve Best in Show at National Working Breeds in 1975, that is when I went onto the committee and I am still there today.

E'Dition son was my pride and joy, he was a gentleman, he like his Mother likes shows and the attention they got, he was not going to be left out on winnings, I made him up to a UK & Irish Champion, he loved the trips to Ireland, travelling with friends and their Newfoundlands. I now have Tibetan Terries and enjoy showing them. To date I have made up 3 Champions in the Breed - CH Aivlys Just One Look, CH Aivlys Best Mate and CH Aivlys Bri'e. Also CH Aivlys Black Bonnie, owned by Mrs Olive Thomas. Bonnie was Top Welsh Dog.

I have been on Richmond committee now for many years as Chief Steward.

Referee: Terry Donovan

I was brought up in South London, my Parents were friends with a Pub Owner who owned a Boxer I used to walk him all around London then we would catch the underground home, in the stations he would sit at my feet then when the trained moved climb on the seat next to me, then off at the next station, I thought Clever Dog I want one of these.

About 1970 when we had moved to Cheshire we bought our First Boxer as a pet, although he won a community show at six months of age. In approximately 1979 in Wales we rescued a show dog and was persuaded to start showing him. The bug bit.

We bought a show Puppy in 1981, subsequent boys & girls followed. I found that although I could train people & their dogs to show, I was a useless handler, so I started to Steward & found that was my Forte. I last handled a Bitch we bred under Terry Thorne, upon returning to him after running her he said "don't give up the stewarding Terry" Enough said.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 8.30am
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 9.30am Bitches & 10.30am Dogs (not before completion of Minor Puppy Bitch)
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- Entry Fees: Entry Fees £14.50 first entry, £2.00 subsequent entries (same dog). 3rd Dog plus (under same ownership £6.75. Veterans FOC, NFC £1.00 and JH £1.00. On-line entry available at www.haveadogday.co.uk
- Prize money. £5.00 to every 1st prize winner. Special Award classes only 1st £20.00, 2nd £10.00, 3rd £5.00, 4th £3.00 and 5th £2.00.
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should also automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from Other Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12. Best in Show The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition. Withdrawal from Other Competition Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 16. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 17. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 18. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 19. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. See reverse of Entry Form for full details.
- No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- Should either Judge be prevented from fulfilling their appointment, the Committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but entry fees will not be refunded.
- 23. The Committee reserve the right to excludes a dog not in a fit state for exhibition doe to disease, vide or any other cause, and if this happens, the entry fee will be forfeited.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B) 3

- These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) a dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
 - Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the K.C. in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or any anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

An owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and the environs of the event including car parks and approaches.

A CLEARLY MARKED EXERCISE AREA WILL BE PROVIDED

Please help us to keep this excellent venue by not letting your dog/s foul at the front of the building, or on the grassed areas near the entrance.

DOGS IN VEHICLES

Remedial action, in accordance with Kennel Club Guidelines, will be taken in the event of any dog being found in a distressed condition

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 16th March 2018

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

- If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- or an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight
- For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes,

whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT

For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any Governing Body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB / CAC / Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where

Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show. **OPEN**

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Show Schedule Notice

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE BOXER BREED COUNCIL HEALTH COMMITTEE

Juvenile Kidney Disease has been reported as a possible health problem in Boxers. So far, the reported cases are consistent with an occurrence of less than 0.1% within the UK Boxer population however we cannot be complacent and this number may simply mean that not all cases are being reported. Boxer Breed Council is therefore encouraging the whole Boxer community to get involved in identifying and reporting cases to allow us to research the condition thoroughly. The symptoms seen are increased thirst and therefore an increase in urination. Loss of appetite, weight loss, stunted growth, lethargy and vomiting are also seen in most cases. When the kidneys are examined by ultrasound they are smaller than normal and often uneven in shape. Symptoms usually start between four months and two years.

Reasonable expenses which are incurred in providing samples will be covered by Boxer Breed Council. All reported cases will remain confidential to the Boxer Breed Council Health Committee and its scientific advisers.
