RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00am
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00am Bitches & 10.30am Dogs
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- Entry Fees: Members £14.00/Ddog, Non-members £17.00/Dog, All Subsequent Entries £3.00/Class (Same Dog). NFC £3.00. Special Award Classes £3.00/Dog. On-Line entries available at www.HaveADogDay.co.uk
- 6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11. Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days: Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- 17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 19. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits, the exhibitors or their property, whether or not caused by any act or omission of themselves or their agents.
- 20. The committee reserve the right to appoint another judge should the appointed Judge be unable to attend, Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but their entry fees will not be refunded.
- 21. The Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits, the exhibitors or their property.

Show Entries and Bank Charges Exhibitors' attention is drawn to the Kennel Club announcement that any Bank Charges incurred by the Club through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques in respect of their entries will be passed on to the Exhibitor concerned. Failure to pay these charges will result in the exhibitor being dealt with by the Kennel Club Committee.

PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR CHILDREN AT ALL TIMES

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used. The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at Shows In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **1st April 2018**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

- (2) Transfer
- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.
- **MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- MAIDEN
 For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)

 NOVICE
 For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and
- Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not)
- **DEBUTANT** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at a Championship Show where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- **GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not

- MID LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed. For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show
- CHAMPION For dogs who have been confirmed a Champion or a Show Champion under the Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club
- **VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
- SPECIAL VINTAGE For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show
- BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team
- NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed
- SPECIAL CATEGORIES (OPEN TÓ BOTH DOG AND BITCH) EXHIBITORS MUST BE ENTERED IN MAIN SHOW
- SPECIAL AWARD JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show
- SPECIAL AWARD POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open class, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- SPECIAL AWARD OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show

JUDGES

Shelagh Walker (Douglasdale)

I first encountered our beloved breed in 1972 when I chased after a man walking two shaggy dogs and discovered they were bearded collies - that seems an eon ago now. The following year my first bearded collie, Corsecott Shona (Mountain Dew of Tambora x Westernisles Lochainneart) was born. A brown girl who was litter sister to Liz & Billy Gault's foundation bitch Corsecott Tawney Tanya.

In time we bred from Shona and showed both her and her offspring with some success although as my children were young and needed me it was mainly at open shows.

After several years I was invited to judge at open showsI remember in the early 80's judging Beardies at Scottish Breeds Open Show with an entry of almost 100 Beardies - what a fantastic day that was.

Due to family circumstances I did have to take a break for a while but in 1995 I found a gorgeous brown puppy for my daughter Andrea - that was Briagha CH Chanderly Moonlight Star of Walkerbrae and my line now comes down from Briagha. In 2013 I awarded CC's for the first time at Border Union CH Show.

I consider it a great honour to be asked to judge our wonderful breed and I thank the committee of North of England Bearded Collie Club for inviting me to judge.

Lynne Salt (Woodlyn)

May I thank the Committee for giving me the honour of judging bitches at the North of England Bearded Collie Show. I have always admired the Bearded Collie and have attended many Club Shows, studying them from the ringside.

My showing and judging experience extends over 45 years and I awarded my first CCs in 1991 in Belgian Shepherd Dogs and in this breed during the period between 1986 and 1996, along with my late husband Vic, we bred 16 UK Champions, many CC winners plus overseas Champions.

Currently I award CCs in 10 breeds in both Pastoral and Working and I judge the Pastoral Group at Championship Show level. I began judging Bearded Collies in 1986 and awarded CCs for the first time in 2016. I am also on the EBCA Judges Sub-Committee.

Dianne Mottram (Mybeards)

Sheba my first beardie was born in 1981, I began showing a few years later and then progressed to judging. I awarded CC's for the first time in 1996 and have since judged them several times at Ch Shows in the UK, also the Winners Show at Amsterdam, Norwegian Club Show, Czech Club Show, the 'Bundessieger' in Germany & Warsaw International Show. Many years ago I enjoyed serving as a committee member of the NEBCC. Due to my involvement with Polish Lowland Sheepdogs I no longer own or exhibit beardies; however I feel very privileged to judge the breed when asked, as they are generally super sound healthy exhibits with that added beardie personality and the sportsmanship of the exhibiters always makes for a very pleasant day.

Fiona Steel (Invercoyle)

I have been involved and lived around dogs for most of my life, there has rarely been a period in my life that has not involved dogs. Alan and I were first owned by a beardie in 1983 when we came across a dog needing to be re-homed, turns out she was bred by Liz and Billy Gault (Lochbarra). We took on two further re-homes which were also Lochbarra dogs. After this we went on to have our first litter from one of those bitches who became our foundation in 1989, which was when we first got involved in showing. We showed and occasionally judged for many years but eventually took a break in 1998 due to family and work commitments.

We lost the last of the Invercoyle line in 2010 and were devastated as we had no dogs in our life. A few months later we were very fortunate to be offered the privilege to be owned by one of Jenny Osborne's (Osmart) last litter, bred by Jenny herself (although the Osmart line continues with her Granddaughter Robynne). We then returned to the show ring with Osmart Belle in Black Satin at Invercoyle.

Since the Coney has started another Invercoyle line and her son and daughter also live with us. I also served on the committee of The Bearded Collie Club of Scotland back in the early 90's as Chairperson and returned to the same club on the committee in 2010 and still serve as a committee member to this day.

I started judging in 1997 and am on the B-list of The Bearded Collie Club of Scotland, I enjoy judging and see it as an opportunity to continue to learn and hopefully influence this wonderful breed.

My other interest is taking action photography shots of this wonderful breed and love to show the world what they get up to when they are not in the ring!

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B) 3

1 These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.

(a) a dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.

(b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

(c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the K.C. in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or any anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

The attention of exhibitors is drawn to the fact that any advertisement for a coat preparation or shampoo or similar either in the Schedule or Catalogue does not imply that the use of such a preparation may not contravene Kennel Club Regulations for the Preparation of dogs for Exhibition F. This also applies to any coat preparation or shampoo or similar on sale at the Show. The attention of exhibitors is directed to the Declaration they are required to sign on the entry form.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm Please take care of your dog

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
