

The North of England Dobermann Club will ensure to the best of their ability that this event is run to Covid safe guidelines. It is the exhibitors' responsibility that they adhere to national and regional Covid guidelines at the time of the event. A thorough Covid-19 risk assessment has been carried out by the club's designated Covid safety officer Rebecca Barber. Anyone seen not to be abiding by the Covid safe rules will be asked to leave the show. If you are displaying symptoms of Covid-19 or have had a positive Covid-19 test within 10 days of the event then you must not attend the show.



Covid-19 Regulations

This show will be held in line with government and Kennel Club Covid-19 guidelines in place at the time of the show. The designated Covid-19 Safety Officer is Rebecca Barber. By entering the show you are agreeing to abide by the Covid-19 risk assessment which is outlined on the club's website and will be displayed at the event.

The main rules which must be abided by are highlighted below:

- If you have displayed symptoms of Covid-19 or have had a positive Covid-19 test within 10 days of the date of the event you must not attend the show
- All judging will be outdoors
- All exhibitors must bring a mask, they will need to be worn when in the ring, in the toilets, in car parking areas and if purchasing refreshments. If you are exempt from wearing a mask you must be carrying your exemption lanyard
- The judge and stewards will be wearing masks when in the ring in accordance with government guidelines at the time of the show
- A track and trace form must be completed by anyone attending the event and must be given to our car parking marshals on arrival
- Any paperwork will only be handled by the people who are designated to do so
- As the car parking is tight there will be parking marshals parking you sensibly and people are asked to wear a face covering when getting themselves and their exhibits in and out of their vehicles, in accordance with government guidelines at the time of the show
- To minimize volume of people at the venue at any one time the show start times will be staggered and there are "not before" times in the schedules
- Light refreshments will be available at the show and strict Covid-19 guidelines will be followed when handling and preparing food
- There will be no tables or chairs provided at the show so people must bring their own
- No ringside spectators are allowed and there will be a designated area to put crates
- There will be disinfecting and hand sanitising stations around the show
- Disinfectant sprays will be in toilet cubicles and must be used to disinfect toilet seats, flush handles and door handles after use. There will be a one in, one out system for the toilets which must be adhered to
- There will be clearly marked entrances and exits to the rings and exhibitors must only enter and exit the rings when asked to do so by a steward
- Exhibitors will be expected to enter in number order and will be given a designated space to stand in the ring and must adhere to social distancing rules whilst in the ring
- All current social distancing measures must be followed at all times whilst inside and outside the venue
- Ring numbers will be given out with pre-ordered catalogues, no catalogues will be available on the day.

Spectator Dogs

Under the Spectator Dog rule, owners will be asked to complete an entry form at the show. All details of the dog and a declaration the dog is healthy will be signed for. Owners will be requested to keep their dogs under strict control at all times. The NEDC reserve the right to refuse entry of any dog if it appears unhealthy or badly controlled. A charge will be payable on the day for each dog. Dogs entered as 'Spectator Dogs' will not be covered by the NEDC insurance and will not be allowed to take part in any competition at the show.

Use of Electrical Equipment at Shows

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

Security at Shows

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

Covid-19 Safety

The Society will ensure to the best of its ability that the event is run to Covid Safe guidelines. It is your responsibility to ensure you comply with national and local restrictions including advice given about non-essential travel in and out of locally affected regions (which must not be ignored) – in the interests of the safety of all participants this may give rise to a short notice refusal of entry at the society's discretion. The Kennel Club will respect the society's exercise of its discretion.

If a competitor, or anyone in their household, has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they must isolate in line with Government advice; www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolation-and-treatment/when-to-self -isolate-and-what-to-do/

The competitor must not attend the event

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will Open at 9.30am
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required
- 3. Judging will commence 10.00am (Bitches not before 1.00pm)
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after all their judging has been completed, the show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed
- Entry Fees: Members: First Entry £15.50/Dog, Non-Members: First Entry £18.50/Dog, All Subsequent Entry £2.50/Per Class (Same Dog), Veteran £8.00/Dog, Veterans over 10 FOC, NFC £2.00. On-Line Entries at www.haveadogday.co.uk
- 6. There is no prize money on offer at this show
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show are strictly forbidden
- 10. <u>Best Puppy in Show</u> (if scheduled) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS see reverse of Entry Form
- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR

For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING

For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

MAIDEN

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

POST GRADUATE

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT

For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any Governing Body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN

For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

CHAMPION

For dogs who have been confirmed a Champion or a Show Champion under Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

VETERAN

For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **31st May 2021**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19

(2) Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

NFC

Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B) 3

1 These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.

(a) a dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.

(b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

(c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the KC in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or any anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

SPECTATOR DOGS

Under the Spectator Dog rule, owners will be asked to complete an entry form at the show. All details of the dog and a declaration the dog is healthy will be signed for. Owners will be requested to keep their dogs under strict control at all times. The NEDC reserve the right to refuse entry of any dog if it appears unhealthy or badly controlled. A charge will be payable o the day for each dog. Dogs entered as 'Spectator Dogs' will not be covered by the NEDC insurance and will not be allowed to take part in any competition at the show.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE ÁT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused

SOFT CRATES

The Kennel Club highlights the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at dog shows as in its view, not all designs offer sufficient protection to dogs.

They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates.

There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside. We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you DO NOT leave dogs unattended, either in the hall or in an open car in the car park.
